Brandi Monts from the DDC came to speak with SAIL to talk about the budget and an idea she had about a vote on how to use the money that is allotted per year. One of the things that should be voted on is whether or not to have in person meetings every

month which costs roughly \$4,000 or we could do just remote meetings. Or, mostly remote meetings and have 1 big meeting in person. All members should vote on how the money should be spent.

The consultants Lisa and Anna are back today to work on the improved vision for SAIL. We started by breaking out into breakout rooms to discuss what Inclusion and Belonging meant to everyone. All SAIL members got a chance to share what they meant to them.

The 2nd breakout room discussed what each group thought SAIL should look like in the future. How many members? What does diversity look like? Where are people from? And How can we recruit members? SAIL members agreed that more members caring for the cause is best, people of all backgrounds, religions, genders, ethnicity should be invited. Ways to get members to join could be word of mouth, if everyone brought a friend that would double membership, asking people what would encourage them to join, sending out flyers and emails to get the word out.

The 3rd breakout room discussed the topics that people wanted to see at the SAIL meetings. Common topics between all the groups included housing, jobs, transportation, and closing the RHCs.

The 4th breakout room discussed how we can build relationships during the SAIL meetings. And the best way to meet, either in person, hybrid, or online.

The 5th breakout room discussed collaborating with other groups. Most of the groups agreed that inviting people from other organizations to discuss what they are working on and to see if their agendas are similar with SAIL's. We could also invite other groups to SAIL's events such as the rallies.

That concluded the discussion from the consultants. Tracy Turner then read the minutes from April's meeting.

Admin Report: From the online attendees perspective, I can say the community summit workshops I participated in last week were very informative with great audio but the visual of the PowerPoint slide presentation was not great and too small to see on Zoom.
